



# IDIOMS RELATED TO EDUCATION



*Cover a lot of ground*

means

**Meaning:** To explain a lot of information in a short time  
**Example:** The teacher covered a lot of ground in the math class today. We learned 3 chapters!

*Cut class*

means

**Meaning:** To skip class without a valid reason  
**Example:** Jonathan cut class many times to attend movies, so he failed the course.

*Draw a blank*

means

**Meaning:** Can't remember the answer/information  
**Example:** I studied this chapter hard, but when it comes to the names of scientist, I draw a blank.

*Hit the books*

means

**Meaning:** To begin to study hard  
**Example:** You can't go to the party because the exam is soon and you should hit the books.

*Brush up on something*

means

**Meaning:** To improve and refresh your knowledge of something that you learned before  
**Example:** I need to brush up on my notes before the test.

*Pull an all-nighter*

means

**Meaning:** To stay up all night studying  
**Example:** It is not a good idea to pull an all-nighter before the exam day.
