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# Maple Syrup in Quebec

Every spring, maple syrup is harvested in the province of Quebec. Maple syrup is made from the sap found inside of a type of tree called a maple tree. Producers tap a tree to collect the sap. Sap can be collected in buckets, but now, most producers use newer technology to collect the sap more efficiently. This sap is boiled for a long time until the sap turns into maple syrup.



*a leaf of a maple tree in the fall!*

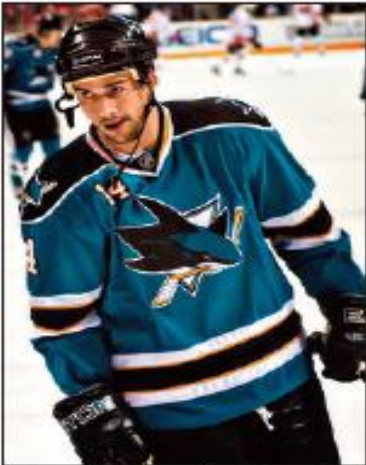


It was discovered by the indigenous people who lived in North America. The first person to write about maple syrup was the explorer Jacques Cartier. Since that time, Quebec has produced more and more maple syrup. Currently, Quebec produces about 75 percent of the world's maple syrup.

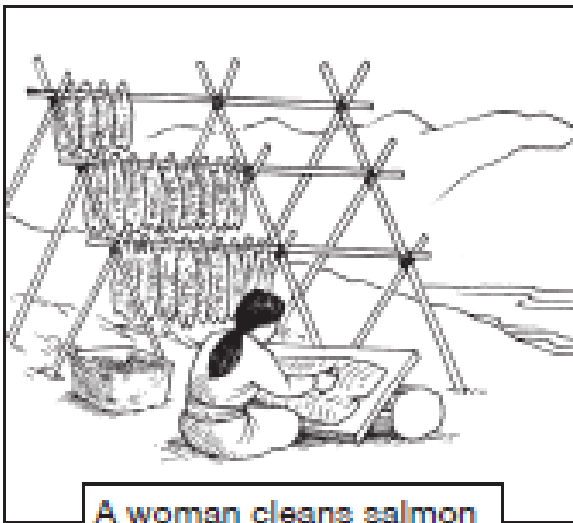

## An important tradition

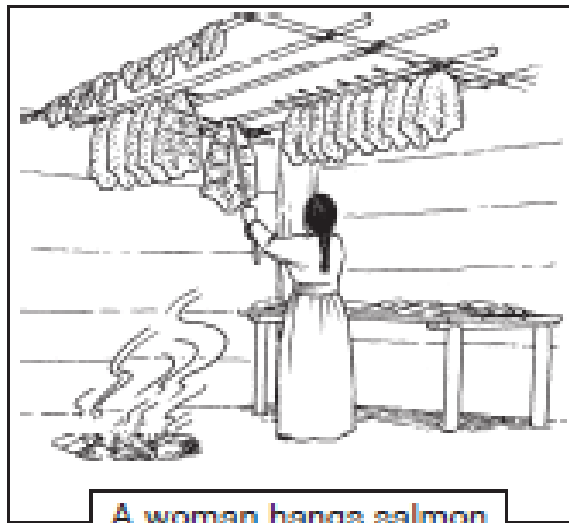
📖 Salmon has always been an important food for Indigenous peoples in British Columbia.
